business supportive policy framework

- Currency Board Arrangement (from 1992, fixed to Euro)
- ❖ Balanced general government budget and low public sector debt burden (ca 3% of GDP)
- Rapid privatization in early 1990s
- Liberal economic policies (no trade barriers or tariffs until joining the WTO and EU)
- Simple tax system
 - flat 21% income (corporate/personal) tax
 - ❖ 0% on all reinvested profits or profits retained in the company

Energy

- ❖ Oil shale in Estonia
 - Reserves ca 1.8 billion tons
 - Annual production 14 mln tons (in 1980s ca 30 mln t)
 - 80% for electricity production
 - 3000 MW (2 power stations), 90% of electricity need
 - 20% for heavy/crude oil & fine chemicals
 - cosmetics & pharma (brownish hair dye)
